Weekly overview	For maths home learning this week I would like Year 5 to continue to watch the maths lessons created by maths specialist teachers. Lesson 1 finishes the fraction topic and the following lessons begins a very important topic on mental strategies for adding and subtracting. <b>It is really important to complete the lessons in order.</b> Each lesson ends with tasks for children to complete before the next lesson. I have also added Target Maths exercises but these are <b>optional</b> . Remember with Target Maths you can choose A, B or C.
